As you read this, we are well into 2020, and our world is in the grip of the devastating COVID-19 pandemic. This Lend A Hand Annual Report is for the calendar year 2019, so you can expect next year's report to be significantly different.

In 2019, thanks to your generosity, LAH provided a record number of grants to our friends and neighbors throughout Greater Boston. That means 738 households received a helping hand from LAH, with over 365 evictions prevented and more than 290 households able to keep their utilities on.

You can take comfort knowing that your gifts help real people manage real-life obstacles of daily living. Just one example is Sonya M. who struggles on a fixed income, living with a disability and unable to find a job in today's shrinking economy. After making a payment plan with her landlord, a \$500 LAH grant helped bring her rent up to date. And Sonya's working with her medical care team to better manage her disability, in hopes of finding a job suited to her capabilities.

Thank you for helping Lend A Hand reach out to so many in need in 2019. And thank you in advance for your continued support for the growing number of those who will turn to us in 2020.


